- 3. Identify an executor (chosen by you) who is qualified to settle your estate promptly and economically with careful attention to your wishes.
- 4. Provide guardianship for any minor children.
- 5. Support charitable organizations that are important to you.

Creating a will isn't complicated. Putting your wishes in writing ensures that the people and causes you care about are taken care of after you're gone. Depending on where you live, a basic will can cost you just a few hundred dollars. Resist the urge to look for a deal, and avoid do-it-yourself kits.
